The Bookkeeper Dies

Jesus tells a parable about forgiving when Peter asks how often should he forgive his brother. Jesus says, "Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began to settle, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. And since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him, the master of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But when that same servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. Then his master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart (Matthew 18.23-35)."

The king had been a very good bookkeeper. He had kept track of the servant's debt meticulously. Ten thousand talents was a sum so large (maybe around sixty million days wages) that no one could hope to repay it (perhaps in our day we would say 'trillions of dollars'). But every small amount was kept track of by the bookkeeper king.

The law keeps track. It knows every sin we commit. Every time we ignore God's word or worship of Him or when we hate our neighbor. The law condemns every time we lust after what our neighbor has or want the worst for him or her. The books are kept with precision and the debt is more than trillions of dollars could pay.

The servant implores the king for mercy. And the bookkeeper dies. How else could one who kept such a record stop keeping a record. The books are erased and the servant is forgiven and freed. The servant had done nothing to earn this. It seems he had wasted and squandered all the money, he could not do better or try harder. He had nothing to offer back to the king.

When you understand your sins and realize there is nothing you can do or give to God, that there is no hope because of your sinfulness, you realize that the only thing left is to rely on God. Have mercy on me, a sinner! Amazingly, God does. He stops counting your sins and erases the books entirely. But why? Not because of you, but the bookkeeper dies. He dies in your place. He takes your debt and pays the full price. Jesus dies for you.

This should enliven the servant to rejoice in the goodness of the master. He should go out and deal with his servants in the same way the king dealt with him. He should be generous and forgive without measure. Yet, he refuses. He finds a fellow servant who owes him a much smaller sum (one hundred days wages) and demands payment. It seems the death of the bookkeeper meant very little to him. So the king gives him what he wants- the ability to keep track of his debts and all who owe him in jail. There the servant will have time to count every debt.

Your King has forgiven you. You have no more debt of sin. It is all done with on the tree. So how should you live? Like what Jesus did for you matters! Die with Jesus to counting sins. Forgive those who sin against you. How many times? Don't keep track, don't be a bookkeeper counting debt, but as your King who forgives huge sums.

Psalms

As you read the Book of Psalms, what comes to your mind? The fact that it is all poetry? Who wrote it? Difficult to understand? The origin? All logical questions.

King David is one of the authors of Psalms. As a shepherd boy he learned to play and sing while tending to his father's flock of sheep or goats.* “The Lord made David a warrior-poet and prophet who united the tribes of Israel as a harmonious kingdom. [David's] collection of songs accompanied by the harp is the basis of the Psalter, one of the most beloved books of the Holy Bible.”

Martin Luther said, “Over the years a great many legends of the saints...books of examples, and histories have been circulated...[and] the Psalter has been neglected.

The Book of Psalms contains all sorts of divine and wholesome teachings and commandments, according to Luther. “It promises Christ's death and resurrection so clearly---that it might well be called a little Bible. In it is comprehended most beautifully and briefly everything that is in the entire Bible.”

Luther also said, “I have a notion that the Holy Spirit wanted to take the trouble himself to compile a short Bible and book of examples of all Christendom or all saints, that anyone who could not read the whole Bible would here have anyway almost an entire summary of it, comprised in one little book.”

Psalms reflects the way the Saints spoke to God “in earnestness and most important matters”, Luther says. “The legends and examples, which speak only of the deeds and

miracles of the saints...cannot know how a man's heart is, even though [Luther] sees or hears of the many great deeds he does...”

To summarize, according to Luther, Psalms presents “all sorts of fair and happy thoughts toward God, more pitiful words of sadness and lamentations, you see into the hearts of the Saints, as into death and hell itself.” You see “fear and hope” in their hearts. And, the fact “that they speak these words to God...is the best thing of all,” not man to man.

“In a word, if you would see the holy Christian Church painted in living color and shape, comprehended in one little picture, then take up the Psalter (Psalms).”

Psalms 1:5-6

“Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgement, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.”

Read the Book of Psalms; it is God's gift to us through the words and songs of the Saints that shows “God Loves Us Eternally!”
